

Luke 24:13-John 4:42**Thursday, April 29 – Luke 24:13-53****Friday, April 30 – John 1:1-28**

1. The first 18 verses have been discussed in Bible Class on Sunday morning. I would invite you to review your notes and look at the worksheet from our Sunday discussion.
2. vv. 19-23 reveal an interesting dialogue the priests and Levites ask John the Baptist who he was. How does John the Baptist's answer show this statement is true: "You have the Bible but you don't have the Bible."

Saturday, May 1 - John 1:29-51

3. Relational evangelism is the most effective means of getting people to come to church. Often times when the unchurched are asked why they don't attend church the response is given, "No one ever invited me." In these verses we are given the method for evangelism work. What is it? How could you use this with an unchurched friend or family member? And if there is a Nathanael response given, how does Philip's response help us?

Sunday, May 2 – John 2:1-25

4. Some people find it offensive that Jesus made so much wine (120 to 180 gallons!). How would you react to a person who is troubled by this??
5. John's Gospel records Jesus' ministry and work in chronological order. The events of vv. 13-17 occurred during his first year of ministry. What makes this act and the repetition of it during Holy Week so saddening? How different really are we?

Monday, May 3 – John 3:1-21

If Jesus told Nicodemus that people had to be born again in order to be saved. The Greek words for "*born again*" can also mean "born from above." Both meanings fit very well here. Certainly we need to be born *again* because our physical birth involved sin. And this second birth comes from God (who is *above*).

6. Some Christians ask, "Are you born again?" How would you answer them? Use verses 16-18 in your answer.

Tuesday, May 4 – John 3:22-4:3

7. Why is verse 27 a good motto for us?

Wednesday, May 5 – John 4:4-42

8. In verse 4 we read that Jesus had to go through Samaria. He had to go through Samaria not because it was the only route (it wasn't), but because his Father had a mission for him to accomplish there. Does God ever direct us to certain places at certain times? If so, how?
9. What did it take to turn the Samaritan sinner into a Samaritan evangelist?
10. In verse 34 Jesus said, "My food is to do the will of him who sent me and to finish his work." In other words, Jesus' very existence was tied up in doing his heavenly Father's will. Sharing God's love with other people brought Jesus refreshment. Can you tell of a time when sharing God's Word with others brought you refreshment?
